Tournament Rules

Teams

- Each school can enter one representative team in the tournament.
- Teams can consist of 8 players in the squad and must be made up of students in years 7 and/or 8.
- Teams can field 5 players with the remaining 3 players in the squad as substitutes.
- Only students who are in the current years 7 and 8 are eligible to play in the tournament.
- Players must be in full-time attendance at the school that they represent in the competition.
- Schools that are found to have played ineligible players may face disqualification from the tournament and their results annulled/matches forfeited.

Format

- Teams will be drawn into four groups of four teams. Each team will play the other team in its group once on a round-robin basis.
- The top two teams in the group will qualify for the quarter-finals. The bottom two teams will be eliminated.
- Teams are awarded 3 points for a win, 1 for a draw and 0 for a loss. In the event of two or more teams finishing with the same number of points, the teams will be ranked in order of the following:
 - Goal difference
 - Goals scored
 - Points gained from matches between the teams

If teams cannot still be separated, the higher ranked team will be determined by drawing lots.

- Matches will last 15 minutes. Stoppages will apply in emergency cases, however teams deliberately found to be wasting time will be penalised.
- Normal football rules apply with the exception that the goalkeeper is not permitted to leave the penalty area; goalkeepers adjudged to have done so will concede a penalty.
- Teams can make unlimited substitutions with the permission of the referee and during a break in play. Substitutions cannot be made after the end of extra-time (i.e. for penalty shoot-outs)
- Matches from the quarter-final onwards will also last 15 minutes with stoppages again only applying in emergency cases. In the case of a draw, 5 minutes of extra-time will be played. If the scores are level after extra-time, the match will be decided on a penalty shoot-out.
- Penalty shoot-outs will follow the conventional rules with 5 penalties apiece with all players taking one penalty each. If the scores are still level, penalties will continue with sudden death until a winner is determined.

Please note:

- Coaches are responsible for the safety and conduct of their students. Please ensure you have adequate personnel to manage your team.
- To ensure good timekeeping we ask all teams to arrive in their kit. Venue rules state that all players must wear the correct footwear and shin pads when playing.
- Red and yellow cards will not be awarded during matches, however in the case of extreme or persistent misbehaviour, officials can order a player to be substituted or even ejected from the remainder of the match or tournament. This also applies to coaches and whole teams.
- Foul and abusive language and behaviour will not be tolerated. Anyone guilty of doing so will take no further part in the tournament and their school will be informed.
- The decision of the officials is final. Please do not to engage in any attempt to influence the officials or this will result the expulsion of your team and annulment of their results.
