Tournament Rules

Teams

- Squads can consist of 10 players and must be made up of students in years 7 and/or 8.
- Teams can field 7 players with the remaining three players in the squad as substitutes.
- Only students who are in the current years 7 and 8 are eligible to play in the tournament.
- Players must be in full-time attendance at the school that they represent in the competition.
- Schools that are found to have played ineligible players may face disqualification from the tournament and their results annulled/matches forfeited.

Format

- The two participating teams will play each other over four periods of 15 minutes with the victor crowned as 2016 Interfaith Games champions for the South Girls Netball event.
- Stoppages will apply in emergency cases, however teams deliberately found to be wasting time will be penalised.
- If the match is a tie at the end of the fourth period, a 5-minute overtime period will be played. If the teams remain tied after overtime, the match will be decided by a further period of sudden death overtime, where the first team to score wins.

Notes

- Coaches are responsible for the safety and conduct of their students. Please ensure you have adequate
 personnel to manage your team. At least one member of staff must be accompanying their students at all
 times.
- To ensure good timekeeping we ask all teams to arrive in their kit.
- Teams arriving late and unable to fulfil their fixtures, will be deemed to have lost the match by 20 points to 0.
- In the case of extreme or persistent misbehaviour, officials can order a player ejected from the remainder of the match or tournament. This also applies to coaches and whole teams.
- Foul and abusive language and behaviour will not be tolerated. Anyone guilty of doing so will take no further part in the tournament and their school will be informed.
- The decision of the officials is final. Please do not to engage in any attempt to influence the officials or this will result the expulsion of your team and annulment of their results.
