Day 1: Arrive in Marrakesh

Arrive in Marrakesh Airport, picked up by our team at the arrivals lounge. Look out for the sign with the AMS School Tours logo.



We will transfer straight to Riad in Marrakesh which is located in the centre of the medieval medina of Marrakesh. The guided tour of Marrakesh includes the 7 saints or rijal sites, the ancient Madrassa, Koutoubia Mosque as well as other Islamic sites such as the city centre mosque. Overnight stay in Marrakesh.

Day 2: Atlas Mountains & Fez

After an early breakfast, we will make our way to the Atlas Mountains, driving to Fez along the foothills of the High Atlas, past Afourer and Ait Atteb and the Cascade D'ouzoud waterfalls.

The waterfalls are one of the most popular day trips from Marrakesh for tourists and Moroccans alike. The Oued Ouzoud drops 110m into the canyon of Oued el-Abid in three-tiered waterfalls.



We will then visit local Berber villages and arrive in Fez later that evening for dinner. Overnight stay in Fez.

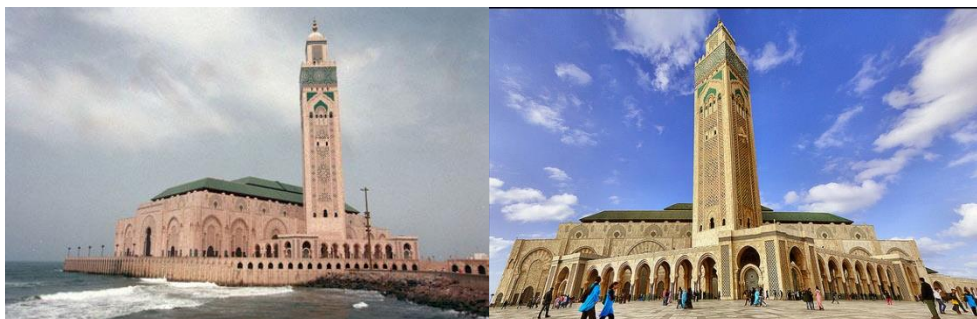
Day 3: Fez

Today we begin the day with a guided tour of Islamic Fes el Bali, including the Kairouine mosque and first university, the gates, and schools of the medina and, if time allows, we may also visit Masjid Mawla Idris for Asr in the afternoon and some more Islamic sites. Overnight stay in Fez.



Day 4: Casablanca

Today we travel to Casablanca via Rabat where we will have a chance to see Mosque Hassan II, the largest mosque in Morocco. We then return to Marrakesh for the evening to rest and explore Marrakesh leisure. Overnight stay in Marrakesh.



Day 5: Activities/free day in Marrakesh

Today you will have some free time in Marrakesh before we head back to London. Activities can be arranged on request.

Suggestions include:

Camel riding, shopping in the ancient souks of Marrakesh, visiting the Marjorelle Gardens. If you are feeling adventurous, quad-biking can also be arranged.

Marjorelle Gardens



The “Jardin Majorelle” in Marrakesh is one of the most visited sites in Morocco. It took French painter Jacques Majorelle (1886-1962) forty years of passion and dedication to create this enchanting garden in the heart of the “Ochre City”. An entrance fee is required to enter The Gardens which also houses a Berber Museum which students may also wish to visit.

Amal Centre Tagine Making Cookery Class

Alternatively, a cooking class can be arranged at the Amal Centre, which helps disadvantaged females such as single mothers, widows and divorced women learn new skills in the catering and hospitality industry.
